



NEBOSH General Certificate

Overview

The NEBOSH National General Certificate in Occupational Safety and Health is a 12 day examination-based qualification. The program consists of 9 days training and 2 days revision, with 2 written examination papers completed on the final day. The program gives a comprehensive understanding of health and safety issues within the workplace.

Target Group

This course is aimed at managers, supervisors, safety representatives and staff who are either involved with health and safety at work, or have an interest in health and safety.

The course includes a 3 hour mock exam which is marked and individual feedback provided to every student prior to taking their final exams.
